Subject: Letter of Interest for the Presidency of McNeese State University

Dear Members of the Search Committee,

It is with great enthusiasm and a profound sense of purpose that I submit my application for the position of President of McNeese State University. As a leader who thrives at the intersection of academic excellence, student-centered innovation, and robust community engagement, I am deeply drawn to McNeese's mission of changing lives through education and community partnership. Throughout my career, most recently as the President of Albany College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences (ACPHS), I have dedicated my leadership to fostering environments where faculty, staff, and students can make a tangible impact locally, nationally, and internationally.

My professional journey is defined by a commitment to **mission-driven leadership** and **visionary transformation**. I believe a President must be more than an administrator; they must be a collaborator who can bridge the gap between the university, business leaders, and the broader community.

Visionary Leadership and Strategic Transformation

During my tenure at ACPHS, I have led a period of significant transformation. In December 2022, we crafted a bold new vision for the institution, followed by the launch of a new strategic plan in January 2024. This plan was not a top-down mandate but the result of a rigorous shared governance process that ensured all voices (faculty, staff, students, and alumni) were heard and valued.

Key successes of this strategic focus include:

- **University-Level Expansion:** I oversaw the largest expansion of programs in the college's history, with 7 new programs approved by the New York Board of Regents in a single year. These include degrees in Psychology, Forensic Science, and Biology, which positioned our institution to qualify for university status.
- **Innovation in Delivery:** To meet the needs of modern learners, we launched "ACPHS Online" in 2024, diversifying our portfolio and extending our reach.
- **Elevated Institutional Status:** In 2025, our commitment to scholarship was recognized when we received the designation of a Research College/University.

Operational Excellence and Enrollment Growth

A thriving university requires fiscal health and a robust student pipeline. At ACPHS, I implemented entrepreneurial practices to ensure institutional sustainability. By restructuring academic units and refining enrollment processes, we achieved remarkable growth as of July 2024:

- **Total applications increased by 18.58%.**
- **Total deposits grew by 35.03%.**
- **Transfer student enrollment surged by 714.29%.**
- **First-year PharmD deposits increased by 210%** over the prior year.

These metrics reflect a data-driven approach to recruitment and a renewed institutional reputation that resonates with prospective students and their families.

Fundraising and Community Relations

I understand that the President is the primary advocate and fundraiser for the university. I have a proven track record of engaging with funding establishments and the community to secure the resources necessary for institutional growth. In just the past year, **fundraising dollars at ACPHS increased by 61%**.

Furthermore, I am a firm believer in university as an "anchor institution." I have worked closely with local economic development chambers and city leadership to serve the region. For example, the mayor of our city invited us to provide wellness services in a new community center, and we have led efforts to determine how to best utilize health clinics

for underserved residents. My ability to build these relationships has been recognized by the *Albany Business Review*, which named me to their **Power 50 list** in 2023, 2024, and 2025.

Collaborative Partnerships and Global Reach

McNeese's commitment to its region must be matched by a global perspective. I have extensive experience in building domestic and international partnerships:

- **Global Networks:** At Howard University, I grew international partnerships from 5 in 2016 to 18 across 6 continents by 2021. At ACPHS, our awareness has expanded to include partnerships in Africa, India, Australia, and Brazil.
- **Pathways to Success:** We recently launched an accelerated pathway to medical school, making ACPHS one of fewer than 10 such programs in the U.S.
- **Strategic Mergers:** I recently co-created a "merger of equals" with a neighboring institution, resulting in a comprehensive university of approximately 4,000 students. This experience in complex organizational transactions is vital for navigating the evolving landscape of higher education.

Supporting Faculty Excellence and Research

The heart of any university is its faculty. As Dean at Howard University, I actively advocated for science faculty, facilitating research collaborations that led to **\$5.3 million in research grants** in a single year. I support faculty by providing linkages to legal counsel for patents and drug discovery, advocating for lab upkeep, and providing seed funding for innovative trials. Under my leadership, our Pharmacy School received a maximum 8-year accreditation cycle, demonstrating a collective commitment to academic excellence.

A Student-Centered Approach

My leadership style is rooted in "Servant Leadership". I am particularly proud that Howard students nominated me for the A. Richard Bliss Jr. Grand Council Citation of Appreciation Award for my service to them. Whether it is celebrating national championships in track or soccer or supporting the 60+ clubs that define student life, I am a President who is present and engaged in the student experience.

Preparation for the Presidency of McNeese

My academic background (a Doctorate and Master's from UNC Chapel Hill) is complemented by executive training at the **Harvard Kennedy School** (Management Development and Crisis Leadership) and **Penn State's Academic Leadership Academy**. These programs have prepared me to navigate budget formulae, manage complex legal implications, and lead through political and cultural shifts while keeping student costs low.

According to *Strengthfinders 2.0*, my top strengths are **Learner, Achiever, Relator, Focus, and Responsibility**. These traits, combined with my coaching certification, allow me to develop talent and inspire high-performing teams to produce their best work.

McNeese State University deserves a leader who is a proven fundraiser, a strategic visionary, and a champion for student success. I am eager to bring my experience in university status transition, enrollment growth, and community integration to Lake Charles to lead McNeese into its next great chapter.
